From August 26 to 30, 2020 Rencontres Internationales Paris/Berlin invites you to discover a unique hybrid edition, in Berlin at Haus der Kulturen der Welt, and simultaneously live online!

After Paris in February at Louvre auditorium and Grand Palais auditorium, Rencontres Internationales Paris/Berlin invites you to discover its new programme from August 26 to 30, 2020 in Berlin at the Haus der Kulturen der Welt and live online. For five days, this year's edition will transform the HKW into a place of discovery dedicated to contemporary moving image practices.

What is specific about contemporary visual culture? What are the specificities and the convergences of the artistic practices crossing new cinema and contemporary art forms? What aesthetic, social and political issues are filmmakers grappling with today? The event will present a selection of 100 works from 33 countries for the first time on site and online, indoors and outdoors, at HKW and in live streaming: documentary forms, experimental fictions, hybrid and multimedia forms, works by well-known artists and young talents mostly presented in German premieres.

Berlin 2020 edition will be hybrid! Outdoor screenings, video exbibition, performances and discussions held on site at HKW will be simultaneously broadcasted live online.

Highlights

Director **Pedro Costa** will be given carte blanche. In a unique visual language, his latest film "Vitalina Varela" tells the life story of a woman who arrives in Lisbon 40 years late. On Sunday, August 30, the film will be shown twice followed by an artist talk with the director. Other highlights include "A Tiny Place That is Hard to Touch" by **Shelly Silver** and the German premiere of **Rosa Barba**'s film "Aggregate States of Matters", which uses breathtaking aerial photographs to report on the disappearance of a glacier in the Andes. In addition to screenings, artist talks invite experts and viewers to discover and reflect on new international artistic forms and critical approaches.
